 - n Utilize the collective experience of everyone
- n Having more people has risks too
 - n What risks?

Why Teams?

- n Having more people has benefits (that can be exploited)
 - n Attack bigger problems in a short period of time
 - n Utilize the collective experience of everyone
- n Having more people has risks too
 - n Miscommunication of expectations
 - n Flowing by inertia; not planning ahead
 - n "Fluid" (or lack of) responsibility for tasks
 - n Conflict/mistrust between team members

Managing Risks in a Team Setting

- n Risks need to be *actively* managed
 - n by clearly defining the product and its scope
 - n by careful planning and organization
 - n by continuously monitoring the progress and direction
 - n ... and adjusting when necessary
 - n by maintaining an open atmosphere

Issues Affecting Team Success

- n Presence of a shared mission and goals
- n Motivation and commitment of team members
- n Experience level
 - n ... and presence of experienced members
- n Team size
 - n ... and the need for bounded yet sufficient communication
- n Team organization
 - n ... and results-driven structure
- n Reward structure within the team
 - n incentives, enjoyment, empowerment (ownership, autonomy)
